## Fundamentals of Discovering a Prospective Terrorist

- Terrorist do not provide warning
- Terrorist normally recon objective before selecting or attacking
  - Watch for note taking, loitering, security-related questions
  - Photographing entry control points, barriers, off-ramps
  - Video while driving when parking is available
- Awareness is a powerful weapon
  - Knowledge terrorist techniques & methods can help prevent an attack
- Random antiterrorism measures (RAM) make life difficult for prospective terrorist
  - Static defenses increase friendly risk; make constant adjustments to avoid this
  - Be creative, “highly visible and unpredictable”
- Assessments sustain active improvements in defensive posture
- Build PIR to guide collection efforts
- Include terrorist considerations into IPB
- Maintain solid link with nearby US facilities and civilian law enforcement
