

**Tripler Army Medical Center  
Postdoctoral Clinical Psychology Residency Program**

The Clinical Psychology Residency Program (CPRP) in the Department of Behavioral Health (BH) at Tripler Army Medical Center (TAMC) is one of the Army's six clinical psychology residency post-graduate training programs for officers holding doctorate degrees in psychology (Ph.D. or Psy.D.). Other Army Affiliated programs are at Madigan Army Medical Center, Brooke Army Medical Center, Walter Reed Army Medical Center, D.D. Eisenhower Medical Center, and Womack Army Medical Center. Five officers are currently participating in the residency program. The post-doctoral residents are selected competitively from interested applicants graduating from one of the U.S. Army's American Psychology Association (APA) accredited clinical psychology internship programs. These individuals are active duty uniformed officer, who once selected, are assigned to the residency program on official military orders. Residents train in varied military and clinical psychology applications. They participate in two year-long rotations including the Embedded Battalion Psychology Rotation where they are assigned to an Infantry or Aviation Battalion in the 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division at Schofield Barracks and Acute Care/Walk-In Clinic Rotation located at TAMC. The residency is an intensive, full-time, 12 month program. Each year we accept five full-time military residents.
